There are no right or wrong answers for any of the Discussion or Reflection responses. We are looking for you to engage with the material in a thoughtful way. This is a great venue for you to flesh out some topics that you are either confused by or intrigued by in that week's Module.

Don't be shy or worried about being honest in your responses. We are hoping for active, engaged conversations on the Discussion Board and thoughtful Reflections.

Navigating the site:

Spend some time tooling around the Canvas site to get familiar with where everything is.
